

Minutes of the Public Hearing of the Board of Trustees of the Village of Williamsville held in the Municipal Building, Williamsville, New York on Monday, April 24, 1978 at 7:40 P.M.

Mayor Sheffer called the public hearing to order at 7:40 P.M.

The Clerk read the notice of public hearing regarding a local law which would establish sewer rents for the Village. PUBLIC HEARING

Mayor Sheffer gave some background on the proposal and what it involves. He stated that in his annual budget report on March 13th he recommended to the Board that sewer rents and expenses be segregated from the General Fund and annual property tax and be billed separately with the water bill. He stated this is a more equitable way of doing this as those using the service will pay for it. Those interested in saving money can do so by cutting down on their water useage. The government will be requiring us to do this with a method of basing at least part of the charge on water consumption. He stated that sewer costs will be an increasing burden on the taxpayers. The method we are proposing will put payments on a quarterly basis. He stated that at the public hearing on April 10th it was stated that the Board is jumping into something too quickly and before other municipalities and also before giving adequate consideration to the matter. He advised that many municipalities in the County are ahead of us. Also, in order to take advantage of federal grants we have to go along with federal mandates and this will become one in the near future. With respect to tax deductibility at income tax time, he stated that what is deductible now should be deductible in the future. LOCAL LAW Establish Sewer Rents

The Mayor stated that with respect to exempt properties and non-profit groups, they will pay for the sewers as they now pay for the water; it is a utility. With respect to senior citizens, the Mayor stated the charge should not affect them too adversely as they do not use that much water. With respect to those who use water and it is not passed into the sewer system, they have some obligation to put this water into the sanitary and not the storm sewer system, such as pools.

He stated that the sewer charge represents 70% of the water consumed and, therefore, water used to wash cars and water gardens will be counted but that could be the 30% on which there is no charge.

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Administratively, with the Village office going on a strictly consumption basis rather than a formula basis there will be no additional personnel required and can be handled by the computer with only a small cost for programming the computer. With use of a formula there would be substantial computer cost and would require a separate mailing which could not be done with the water bill.

Trustee Miller advised that they had reviewed the water useage of residential and commercial consumers. At the public hearing a statement was made that residents would be paying more than the commercial consumers. In comparing bills for three months we find that the average commercial account pays approximately 10 times what the average residential account pays. The commercial accounts take up about 8% of the Village area.

Richard Hill, 18 Brookside, asked for clarification of the commercial accounts review and this was provided by Trustee Miller. Mr. Hill asked what terms would be used to describe this charge and Trustee Miller stated it would be called the sanitary sewer rent. Mr. Hill stated he did not believe this would be tax deductible if they call it that and Trustee Miller stated it would make no difference. Mayor Sheffer stated that what was deductible now should be deductible in the future. Attorney Troy advised he has been led to believe that this is a deductible item.

James Saia, 20 Belmont, stated he did not believe that the commercial consumers would be paying their fair share of the charges under the strictly water consumption formula. Trustee Miller again answered that the survey they ran showed that they paid more.

Former Trustee Walter Hansen asked if basing some of it on assessed valuation wouldn't be more equitable. Trustee Miller stated it should be based on what is put into the system. You pay for what is treated.

Mr. Saia stated that in relation to cutting down on water useage in order to cut down on your bill, this would not be so as it would take a lot of cutting down to make a difference in what is put into the system and if what is put in goes down then the Village gets less money and there has to be a point where a plateau is reached.

Mayor Sheffer stated that our bill will go down if we pass less water through the Town.

Town Councilman Harold J. Collier appeared and spoke on this matter. He stated he wanted to give residents an idea of what we are up against based on the 1972 Water Pollution Control Act. He stated the Mayor and Trustees are correct in everything they are saying. We are now building a very expensive water treatment facility for use by the Village, Town and Clarence. When we accepted the

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funding from EPA we also accepted the responsibility of minimizing the amount of water going into the sewers. The more water you put in the more you will pay. The operation and maintenance costs will be upwards of \$4 Million Dollars annually and that means that you as residents will pay a percentage of the costs. Under mandates, the Village and Town are doing infiltration and inflow studies. There are many sewers that are getting excess amounts of storm water and we are under mandate to get it out. Councilman Collier stated that in District 1 which includes Snyder and Eggertsville we are on a water consumption percentage and have found that those who use less water pay less. Older people used less water and therefore paid less. Larger families paid more. What the Board is doing is what the government is mandating for us. He stated that when the Town began monitoring the amount of water coming from the Village it was more than we anticipated and if the Town billed the Village on the basis of this amount it would drive everyone out. The Village now pays a portion of the amount on the basis that the Village will initiate a major program trying to overcome this problem. The storm water must be taken out of the sanitary sewer. This is one way of easing the burden on the taxpayers. With respect to income tax deductibility, Councilman Collier stated the more we talk about it the more we invite the Internal Revenue Service to look into it. He stated the Village had been awarded a large sum of money for construction of the sewer on Mill Street, no questions asked, because you adhere to federal mandate. Establish Sewer Rents (Con't)

Mr. Saia asked if all Town residents get billed according to water consumption and Councilman Collier stated they do not, but they are going on it shortly, either by the end of this year or next year. Mr. Saia said the Village should have a special district as the Town does and Mayor Sheffer stated that legally the Village is not allowed to do this. The Town can.

Mr. Saia stated we should be able to deduct the tax as we are paying for the plant and Councilman Collier stated we are not paying back any money to the State or Federal governments. We are only repaying those who loaned us money for this.

Mr. Hill stated that if consumption of water goes down, money taken in goes down and you still have to pay bills and salaries. When you reach a certain plateau you are going to have to raise the 70% figure. Mayor Sheffer said this was correct but that the less water consumed, the less water into the system and the less paid to the Town for treatment.

Mr. Hill asked about how much flow comes through the Village from other areas and then goes into the Amherst system. Mayor Sheffer stated the Village is monitoring this and we would be reimbursed by the Town for any flow coming into our system from the south area.

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Mr. Hill asked about those areas that have no storm sewers so that when we get flooding the water goes into the sanitary sewers. Mayor Sheffer stated the infiltration and inflow study relates to this problem. Councilman Collier stated the government is now investigating the possibility of funding storm sewers to alleviate the infiltration and inflow problems.

With relation to the income tax deductibility question, Mayor Sheffer stated the Board should decide on the segregation of sewer costs on the basis of its necessity and the good of the Village rather than on whether it will be tax deductible or not.

ON MOTION by Trustee Kuzon, seconded by Trustee Walker, the hearing was closed at 8:30 P.M.

Mayor Sheffer called the meeting to order at 7:35 P.M.

Brownie Troop No. 1090 from Maple Elementary School led the group in the Pledge of Allegiance.

ON MOTION by Trustee Walker, seconded by Trustee Kuzon, the minutes of the regular meeting held April 10, 1978 were approved.

ON MOTION by Trustee Kuzon, seconded by Trustee Walker, the minutes of the public hearing held April 10, 1978 regarding the General Fund, Water Fund and Sewer Fund Budgets were approved.

Unanimously carried.

ON MOTION by Trustee Sugg, seconded by Trustee Walker, the minutes of the public hearing held April 10, 1978 regarding the Federal Revenue Sharing Fund Budget were approved.

Unanimously carried.

ON MOTION by Trustee Kuzon, seconded by Trustee Walker, it was moved to suspend the rules at 7:40 P.M. in order to hold a public hearing on a local law which would establish sewer rents for the Village. The hearing was closed at 8:30 P.M.

Unanimously carried.

Mayor Sheffer reported that he had received the semiannual report from the Joint Glen Park Board. The Board is obligated to report to both the Village and Town on a semiannual basis. Trustee Sugg as former Chairman of that Board and now as liason to the Joint Committee has submitted the report to us and to the Town. He acknowledged receipt of the report and thanked them for it.

ON MOTION by Mayor Sheffer, seconded by Trustee Kuzon, vouchers in the sum of \$53,697.23 were approved as follows:

Mayor Sheffer advised there were three large vouchers - one to NYS Social Security Agency for \$6,161.04, one to Erie County Water Authority for \$29,657.06 and one to IFT Grinnell Corp. for \$1,986.90.

Unanimously carried.

Mayor Sheffer advised his second resolution pertains to the adoption of the annual budget for the fiscal year 1978-1979. This includes the General Fund, Water Fund, Sewer Fund and Debt Service Fund. We had a public hearing on April 10th pertaining to the tentative budget. The Board has considered the comment made at the hearing and other input and after study has recommended several changes amounting to an increase in the tax rate of \$.526. The tentative tax rate had been \$11.71 under the proposed budget. This is now \$12.23. This is a reduction from the \$15.28 rate this past year. However, this is not a decrease in total charges that Villagers will pay because of the separate sewer charge.

The Mayor advised that the changes in the budget include \$2,000 added to our insurance budget. This brings it up to \$28,000 and is based on the bills we have received for insurance and those we are anticipating. We also have to cover the Glen Park building and the Christian Church which were not in previous budgets. He stated that \$1,080 has been added for tree planting. At the time of the proposed budget we expected to take \$4,500 out of the revenue sharing funds but found we can only take \$3,400 out of those funds. In order to fund the whole project we are recommending the difference be added to our budget.

With respect to Glen Park, the Mayor advised that the Joint Board had recommended that the Town and Village budget \$3,000 each for maintenance and operation costs. The Town did this last December as they are on a different fiscal year than we are. We are recommending this be done in the Village too. At the time of the tentative budget we thought it could be taken out of community development funds but their restrictions do not allow us to do this. One project we could allocate for was Glen Park but community development funds cannot be used for maintenance type costs so we are putting this in our General Fund budget.

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The Mayor advised that \$300 is being subtracted from the proposed allocation for the Village Housing Agency and this only leaves a budget of \$100 for this agency. Last year this funded our program of surveying the senior citizens and the hiring of the consultant and that job is now done. At present, what the agency will be used for is going to be up to this Board and the Senior Citizens Committee. The \$100 is just a token amount for miscellaneous expenses.

He stated the Board has recommended that \$4,500 be added to contractual costs for garbage pickup. Our contract will be up at the end of May. The Village is giving considerations to alternate methods but no decision is made yet. At present, the Village will probably remain under the contract.

The Mayor added that \$500 is being added to cover additional Johnny-on-the-spots for use at Island Park during the celebrations there.

The Mayor said these are the recommendations the Trustees have made for additions to the tentative budget. He stated he agreed with them. Most are based on some changes in charges since the tentative budget was proposed in early March.

ON MOTION by Mayor Sheffer, seconded by Trustee Walker, the following resolution was adopted:

The Mayor stated the Board had appointed the Village Attorney, Trustee Miller and himself as the negotiating team to negotiate the new Department of Public Works contract which expires in May and until that is completed the salaries cannot be definitely

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set. Every year we put in a lump sum amount to provide for any changes in the contract. He stated the public hearing on the budget was held on April 10th but if anyone has any comments to make tonight the Board would be glad to hear them.

Trustee Kuzon asked about interfund transfers and the Clerk advised this was no change in the budget but pertained to the new debt service fund bonds and loans.

Trustee Kuzon stated that last year he had difficulty approving the budget but that this year's proposed budget he finds to be acceptable. He stated the budget adequately covers the proposed financial matters of the Village.

Unanimously carried.

The Mayor stated his next resolution dealt with the allocation of Federal Revenue Sharing funds. He stated that at our last two meetings we held the required public hearings on this.

ON MOTION by Mayor Sheffer, seconded by Trustee Walker, the following resolution was adopted:

WHEREAS this Board of Trustees has met at the time and place specified in the Notice of Public Hearing on the tentative budget and heard all persons desiring to be heard thereon;

Unanimously carried.

Trustee Miller thanked Town Councilman Harold J. Collier for his work in assisting us in our obtaining the award for the Mill Street sewer which is \$112,261. He also thanked Tom Ketchum in the Town Engineering Department for his assistance. This is a good sign of the cooperation between the Village and Town since the Town applied for this grant for us.

He thanked the Department of Public Works and Mr. Way for the good job in the road shoulder repair work and for the cleaning of the sidewalk at Union Road

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Trustee Miller stated the negotiating team has reached an agreement with the Department of Public Works and his first resolution related to this.

ON MOTION by Trustee Miller, seconded by Trustee Walker, the following resolution was adopted:

RESOLVED that the Village of Williamsville accepts and the Mayor is authorized to execute on behalf of the Village, the agreement reached April 7, 1978 with the American Federation of State, County and Municipal Employees, A.F.L.-C.I.O. Local No. 1783c.

Mayor Sheffer advised this is not the annual contract but concerns a lesser matter pertaining to a grievance by one employee.

Unanimously carried.

Trustee Miller stated his next resolution dealt with the subject of our public hearing tonight.

ON MOTION by Trustee Miller, seconded by Trustee Walker, the following resolution was adopted:

RESOLVED that Local Law #4 - 1978, SANITARY SEWER RENTS, which was the subject of tonight's public hearing, is hereby adopted.

Trustee Miller stated that in addition to the way the law appears in the agenda there is an addition to Section 41.20(B). The part relating to 70% contained in the parenthesis at the end of that paragraph is deleted and the following is added - "...for the fiscal year 1978-79. Each year thereafter the rate shall be determined by the Board of Trustees after a public hearing. The charge assessed shall be a percentage amount of the amount charged for water consumption."

Trustee Kuzon stated he supported the separation of the charges and the rate on water consumption. It is a more equitable means of charging for this. In most cases it will mean a savings for the senior citizens. The individual now has some limited control over that portion of his sewer charge. Most of the questions raised have been satisfactorily answered in his mind.

Vote on Roll Call: Trustee Sugg - aye; Trustee Miller - aye; Trustee Walker - aye; Trustee Kuzon - aye; Mayor Sheffer - aye. Ayes-5; Noes-0.

Unanimously carried.

Mayor Sheffer stated that in his over two years on the Board this has been one of the most difficult yet important issues to face the Village. He commended the Board on their favorable action on this matter.

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Trustee Sugg reported that the Village Youth Committee has been reorganized and will hold its first meeting on May 11th.

She reported that the Beautification Committee is hard at work on the tree planting program. Bids have been received and 20 more trees will be planted with the cooperation of the Department of Public Works.

Trustee Sugg reported that the Glen Park Committee held its re-organization meeting in April and Jim Tammaro is to be Chairman and Donald Schueckler will be Vice Chairman. She stated the Glen Park hill has been reshaped. She reported the volunteer program is still active. She stated many trees have been planted in the park.

ON MOTION by Trustee Sugg, seconded by Trustee Walker, the following resolution was adopted:

Trustee Sugg advised that Frances McLaughlin, Principal of St. Peter and Paul School will be acting as an ex-officio member of this committee.

Unanimously carried.

Trustee Walker stated his first two resolutions deal with vandalism in the parks and the hiring of park guards. We have to do this even though we don't like to. We did this last year. On the first day the guards were not used, the kids went back and did \$2,000 damage in one evening. We will be using \$3,300 in Federal Anti-Recession Funds. He stated the Vandalism Committee is working and we hope they will find solutions to this problem.

ON MOTION by Trustee Walker, seconded by Trustee Kuzon, the following resolution was adopted:

In answer to the question whether or not this includes Glen Park, Trustee Walker advised they were going to try and include Glen Park in this. However, he said they would like to go to the Glen Park Joint Committee and see if they could get some money for this from the Town.

Trustee Miller stated he still had the same reservations that he had last year and feels that this is to some extent a duplication of services we should be receiving from the Town. From a public works standpoint it seems as though we repair the damage and the vandals are right behind us tearing it up again. He stated the Town should be petitioned to increase the patrols in all of our parks.

Trustee Kuzon stated he had difficulty with the high hourly rate. He stated however, that it is wiser to pay the guards than to pay the high cost to repair the vandalism damage, which would be higher than the \$3,300.

Trustee Miller stated there should be strict enforcement of park regulations and all offenders should be apprehended and we should follow through on the court cases.

Mayor Sheffer stated he voted against an almost identical resolution last year, but figures show we need them. He stated his opposition is to the \$6.50 hourly rate which seems to be an extremely high rate for park guards.

Trustee Miller stated we are not speaking of night watchmen but of duly appointed and authorized police officers who have the power of arrest. He stated this rate is considerably less than what an off-duty officer can make in other security jobs.

Former Trustee Walter Hansen stated it is a good idea to extend the time the guards are at the parks. He asked if the off-duty officer had the power to act as if he were on duty, and Mayor Sheffer advised the officer had full authority whether on or off duty.

Mayor Sheffer asked if Trustee Walker was familiar with the rates in security jobs and Trustee Walker advised they could earn \$10.00 per hour in department stores at the plazas. He stated an on-duty patrolman can earn about \$16,000 per year.

Mayor Sheffer asked if the vandalism cost was less with the guards and Trustee Walker stated it was.

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Trustee Sugg stated that not all vandalism is done by youths.

Rita Andrews, 128 S. Union Road, asked about the hours for the guards and Trustee Miller stated the hours are still flexible.

Unanimously carried.

ON MOTION by Trustee Walker, seconded by Trustee Kuzon, the following resolution was adopted:

RESOLVED that Trustee Roger Walker be authorized to take such steps as necessary to hire park guards as per prior resolution.

Trustee Walker stated his next resolution dealt with the leasing of 1,750 square feet at the Hutchinson Hose Co. Station #2 on Sheridan Drive. Some years ago the Village realized that service to the north areas of the Village could be better if the equipment were closer to them. The Fire Company built the station rather than put the burden on the taxpayers and we lease the space from them.

ON MOTION by Trustee Walker, seconded by Trustee Miller, the following resolution was adopted:

RESOLVED that the Mayor be authorized to sign a lease with Hutchinson Hose Company for rental of Fire Station #2 from June 1, 1978 to May 31, 1979, 1750 square feet, annual rent \$4,500.00.

Mayor Sheffer asked if this was the same amount as previous years and if the item was budgeted and Trustee Walker advised it was the same and the item was in the budget.

Unanimously carried.

Trustee Kuzon advised that the third of his resolutions listed on the agenda was being tabled so they could consult with Bissell Merrill Associates about it.

Trustee Kuzon stated Village law requires that the Board appoint the Chairman and Vice Chairman of the Board of Appeals and we are reappointing the same men this year as last.

ON MOTION by Trustee Kuzon, seconded by Trustee Walker, the following resolution was adopted:

RESOLVED that Frederick S. Wood be appointed Chairman and Jack W. Hewson be appointed Vice Chairman of the Board Appeals during the 1978-1979 official Village year.

Trustee Kuzon stated he is liason to the Board of Appeals and as liason he is supposed to make the resolutions appointing members of the committee. This procedure was established in the past and should be followed now. Since his resolution was defeated, Trustee Kuzon stated he should be given the opportunity to make another resolution at the next meeting.

Mayor Sheffer stated the Board is scheduled to meet on May 3rd which is before our next Board meeting and it is important that this appointment be made tonight in order not to hold up the petitioner any longer than necessary and this home owner has already been delayed once. He stated that of the 25 members of the Board of Appeals

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who have served since it was established, 9 have served one term or less. Over the last five years, there have been six new appointments. Other committees have various terms of service but the Board of Appeals comes under the State law and the terms are for five years which is a substantial amount of time.

Trustee Kuzon stated that in the last 10 years three have been reappointed and since 1939 one-fifth have been reappointed at various times. Mayor Sheffer stated four-fifths have not been reappointed.
