Trustee Kuzon stated his first resolution dealt with the topic of a public hearing held at our last meeting regarding four stop signs which are already in position. The reason the four are offered together as one resolution is to consolidate the local law. He stated that if any Trustee objected to this they could each be voted on separately. No one objected to doing this.

Trustee Miller stated that for the last two weeks the Department of Public Works has been assisting the Water Department in working on locating some of our water leaks. We have been running three shifts for the last seven days. They have been checking the meter pits so we can obtain the information we need to proceed with our correction of the water loss problems. The unaccountable water loss is now down to 11,700 gallons per hour. It was 28,000 gallons per hour before we started our work. This has been affected through meter repairs and repairing of leaks in hydrants, and in the private section as well as the public sector. In cooperation with the Fire

Department we have established the areas where we have a low fire flow in different hydrants. West of the bridge the flow is all right. On the east side of the bridge there is a drop in the flow due to some valves being open partially and this affects the volume of water. At the special meeting we authorized the engineer to do specifications for work on the valves. This work should improve the fire capabilities in the Village and substantially increase the water pressure and flow to domestic users. Trustee Miller stated we appreciate the work of the Department of Public Works on this project. We also appreciate the cooperation of the business and residential community in this.

Trustee Miller stated his first resolution was a bond resolution for construction of the Mill Street sanitary sewer. The contract has been awarded after modifications have been made on the original proposal which was found to be inaccurate. The bond amount is \$146,000 of which 75% will be reimbursed by the DEC and EPA.

BOND RESOLUTION OF THE VILLAGE OF WILLIAMSVILLE,
NEW YORK, ADOPTED August 28, 1978, AUTHORIZING
THE CONSTRUCTION OF AN 8-INCH SANITARY SEWER LINE
IN THE VILLAGE, STATING THE ESTIMATED MAXIMUM COST
THEREOF IS \$146,000 APPROPRIATING SAID AMOUNT
THEREFOR, AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$146,000
SERIAL BONDS TO FINANCE SAID APPROPRIATION, AND
AUTHORIZING ANY AMOUNTS RECEIVED FROM THE UNITED
STATES OF AMERICA AND/OR THE STATE OF NEW YORK TO
BE EXPENDED TOWARDS THE COST OF SAID SPECIFIC
OBJECT OR PURPOSE OR REDEMPTION OF ANY BONDS
ISSUED THEREFOR OR TO BE BUDGETED AS AN OFFSET
TO THE TAXES/ASSESSMENTS FOR PAYMENT OF THE
PRINCIPAL AND INTEREST ON SAID BONDS.

RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF
WILLIAMSVILLE, IN THE COUNTY OF ERIE, NEW YORK (by the favorable vote
of not less than two-thirds of all the members of said Board) AS
FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Village of Williamsville (herein called
"Village"), in the County of Erie, New York, is hereby authorized to
construct additions and improvements to the existing Village owned
and operated sewage system, consisting of an eight inch sanitary sewer
line on the west side of Mill Street from Main Street to the Village
line, in the Village, together with the necessary furnishings, equip-
ment, machinery and apparatus in connection therewith, all in accor-
dance with ~~XXXXXX~~ specifications prepared by Fruchtbaum Associates, and
plans prepared by Bissell, Merrill & Associates, duly licensed engineers of the
State of New York, on file in the office of the Village Clerk and
hereby approved by the Board of Trustees and approved or to be approved
by the State Commissioner of Health. The estimated maximum cost of said

specific object or purpose, including preliminary costs and costs incidental thereto and the financing thereof is \$146,000 and the said amount is hereby appropriated therefor. The plan of financing includes the issuance of said serial bonds and the levy and collection of a tax upon all the taxable real property within the Village to pay the interest on said bonds and the principal thereof as the same shall become due and payable. It is anticipated that two-thirds 2/3% of said cost will be specially assessed against the property determined to be specially benefited by said improvements and the amount of any special assessments hereafter levied and collected on such property will be budgeted as an offset to the taxes thus to be levied. Any funds received from the United States Environmental Protection Agency for said specific object or purpose are hereby authorized to be expended towards the cost of said specific object or purpose or redemption of said bonds, or to be budgeted as an offset to the taxes and/or assessments for the payment of the principal and interest on said bonds.

Section 2. Serial bonds of the Village in the principal amount of \$146,000 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the provisions of the Local Finance Law, constituting Chapter 33-a of the Consolidated Laws of the State of New York (hereinafter called "Law"), to finance said appropriation.

Section 3. The following additional matters are hereby determined and stated:

(a) The period of probable usefulness of the specific object or purpose for which the bonds authorized by this resolution are to be issued, within the limitations of §11.00 a. 4 of the Law, is forty (40) years.

(b) Current funds are not required to be provided as a down payment prior to the issuance of the bonds herein authorized or any notes issued in anticipation of the sale of such bonds pursuant to the provisions of §107.00 d. 3 (1) of the Law.

(c) The proposed maturity of the bonds authorized pursuant to this resolution will exceed five (5) years.

Section 4. Each of the bonds authorized by this resolution and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of said bonds, shall contain the recital of validity prescribed by §52.00 of the Law and said bonds and any notes issued in anticipation thereof shall be general obligations of the Village, payable as to both principal and interest by general tax upon all the taxable real property within the Village without limitation of rate or amount. The faith and credit of the Village are hereby irrevocably pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on said bonds and any notes issued in anticipation of said bonds and provision shall be made annually in the budget of the Village by appropriation for (a) the amortization and redemption of the bonds and notes to mature in such year and (b) the payment of interest to be due and payable in such year.

Section 5. Subject to the provisions of this resolution and of the Law, pursuant to the provisions of §30.00 relative to the authorization of the issuance of bond anticipation notes, or, the renewals of said Notes and of §50.00 to 60.00 of the Law, the powers and duties of the Board of Trustees relative to authorizing bond anticipation notes and prescribed the terms, form and contents and as to the sale and issuance of the bonds herein authorized and of any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of said bonds, and the renewals of said notes, are hereby delegated to the Village Treasurer, the chief fiscal officer of the Village.

Section 6. The validity of the bonds authorized by this resolution and of any notes issued in anticipation of said bonds, may be contested only if:

- (a) such obligations are authorized for an object or purpose for which the Village is not authorized to expend money, or
- (b) the provisions of law which should be complied with at the date of the publication of such resolution, are not substantially complied with,

and an action, suit or proceeding contesting such validity is commenced with twenty days after the date of such publication, or

(c) such obligations are authorized in violation of the provisions of the constitution.

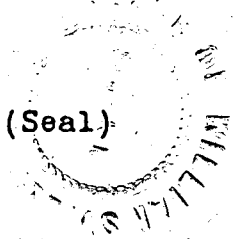

NOW, THEREFORE, the contract for one leaf loader is awarded to Wellington Bros. Equipment Co., Inc. for their bid of \$7,373.00.

Unanimously carried.

Trustee Miller stated his next resolution speaks to a situation that has been brought to our attention regarding an extension of the Mill Street sewer on the southerly portion with respect to a 20 foot extension to the south to accommodate a 6" lateral that comes out at that point. Trustee Miller stated it was his feeling that this type of change order should be considered by the Board because it is in keeping with the general concept of supplying services to our residents.

ON MOTION by Trustee Miller, seconded by Trustee Walker, the following resolution was adopted:

RESOLVED that the Mayor is authorized to sign Change Order #1 for the Mill Street Sanitary Sewer contract, which would extend sewer in front of James Saia property 20 feet to south to accommodate existing 6" lateral building connection pending percentage qualification cost of the funding agencies.

Mayor Sheffer stated this would not be included under the bond resolution but would be subject to 75% federal reimbursement which minimizes the cost to the Village. Trustee Miller stated the gross amount would be about \$984.00. The federal percentage, if approved, would be \$738.00 and the net cost to the Village would be \$246.00. There is a chance this would not be approved. The New York State plumbing code states it only has to be within 150 feet of the property line for a tap in.

James Saia, 20 Belmont, stated he had been told by another Board in 1959 that a sewer would be put in and he had put in the 6" lateral at that time so he could tap in. However, this was never done so he has a septic tank. He stated that if this extension is not done, he will not tap in.

Unanimously carried.

Trustee Miller stated his next resolution deals with updating some charges of the water department that they make to the plumber for the cost of the corporate stop, the curb stop, water box and tap. This was raised last year but the cost to us has been raised again.

Mayor Sheffer called the public hearing to order at 7:37 PM.

The Clerk read the notice of public hearing regarding a local law which would amend Sections 1.12 and 1.22 of the Sign Code of the Village by providing for an increased initial fee for obtaining a sign permit and changing the renewal of sign permits to every five years on July 1st rather than yearly.

PUBLIC HEARING

Mayor Sheffer then turned the hearing over to Trustee Kuzon who stated the new law would increase the length of time a sign permit is valid for. Presently it is valid for only one year and this would be changed to five years. We have approximately 151 signs in the Village that have to be renewed every year and from an administrative standpoint this is very time consuming. With respect to a change in the fees charged, Trustee Kuzon stated he has informed the Trustees that the figures he has listed are just a starting point for beginning our discussions and he is open to any suggestions from them or the public as to whether the fees should be kept at the present rate or increased. Trustee Kuzon gave a history of the way the fees have been increased over the years since they were first adopted in 1958. Under the new fee schedule, the cost would be as follows: for 30' or less it would cost \$15.00 on application, an increase of \$5.00; for 31' to 40' it would be \$20.00, an increase of \$5.00; and for 41' or more it would cost \$30.00 on application. This is also an increase of \$5.00. This was last increased six years ago and the \$5.00 increase comes to less than \$1.00 per year as it is good for five years. The renewal fees are also increased by \$5.00 - for 30' or less \$25.00; for 31' to 40' \$30.00 and for 41' and over \$50.00.

James Saia, 20 Belmont, stated he thought it was a good idea to put this on a five year basis. He asked if there would be a rebate if someone should go out of business and Trustee Kuzon stated at present there is no provision for this but the Trustees have already brought this up and it will be discussed.

Trustee Kuzon stated the administrative costs of the Building Department for handling the sign permits will be examined and if we do not find justification for an increase in the fees we will probably keep them as they are now. The fees mentioned are just a starting point for discussion.

Mayor Sheffer stated he thinks it is a good idea to put the sign permits on a five year basis but the fees should not be increased just because we haven't increased them since 1972. Should be done only if the administrative costs justify there being raised.

A resident of 23 S. Long Street asked if she could request a no parking sign for her street as she cannot park in front of her house because of all the business customers who park there and Trustee Kuzon advised this could be taken up at the regular meeting.
