Trustee Baer reported that the Town of Amherst Youth Board Award Dinner will be at the Transit Valley Country Club on Thursday, January 22nd. This is the first year that the Williamsville Youth and Recreation Board will be making a Special "Service to Youth" Award and the first recipient of this award will be former village trustee Dick Gallagher for the many years of service he has given to the youth programs in both the Village and the Town.

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Superintendent of Public Works Laubisch stated that Christmas trees are being collected. They are being taken to the Department of Public Works garage and being put thru the chipper. These chips are available to Village residents who bring their own containers, between the hours of 8:00 A.M.- 3:00 P.M., Monday thru Friday.


The undersigned hereby offers to dedicate to the Village of Williamsville the street now known as Bobbie Lane, all owned by the undersigned and described as follows:

Any property taxes assessed upon the above described parcel from January 1, 1987 to the date of conveyance to the Village of Williamsville shall be paid in full by the undersigned.



To eliminate these violations, residents are urged to call as soon as a given violation starts, so that the police may have a chance to arrive in time to witness the violation. Of course, violations already completed should continue to be reported. The police will do their best to enforce the ordinance.
