

Minutes of the Regular Meeting of the Board of Trustees of the Village of Williamsville held in the Williamsville Village Hall, 5565 Main Street, Williamsville, New York on Monday, November 14, 1988 at 7:35 P.M.

Unanimously carried.

ON MOTION BY Mayor Brenton, seconded by Trustee Kibby, the following resolution was adopted:

WHEREAS the Village Clerk has returned her warrant and tax roll and has delivered to the Board of Trustees an account of taxes remaining due, amount to \$21,015.23 (see attached listing) containing description of the land upon which taxes are unpaid as the same were placed upon the tax roll, together with the amount of the tax so assessed and interest thereon, and

WHEREAS the said Village Clerk under oath has sworn that the taxes mentioned in such account remain unpaid, and that after diligent efforts she has been unable to collect same, and

WHEREAS upon receiving such account from the Village Clerk, the Board of Trustees compared the same with the original tax roll of the Village, and

WHEREAS said Board of Trustees find such account to be true transcript and has certified to the effect that they have compared it with the original tax roll and find it to be correct,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Clerk of the Village of Williamsville is hereby credited by this Board of Trustees with amount of said account in said return, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a certificate executed by each member of the Village Board be attached to the account of unpaid taxes stating a total of unpaid taxes in the amount of \$21,015.23 and reciting that the account has been compared and found to be correct; and that the Clerk transmit said account and certificate to the appropriate officer of the County of Erie within 15 days to enforce collection pursuant to Section 1442 of the Real Property Tax Law.

Unanimously carried.

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ON MOTION by Mayor Brenton, seconded by Trustee Schlifke, the following resolution was adopted:

RESOLVED that the next election in the Village of Williamsville will be held on Tuesday, March 21, 1989, and

FURTHER RESOLVED that the following offices will be filled at that election:

Two (2) Trustees for four (4) year terms.

Unanimously carried.

ON MOTION by Mayor Brenton, seconded by Trustee Bindert, the following resolution was adopted:

RESOLVED that for the election to be held March 21, 1989, the Village of Williamsville shall be divided into three election districts as follows:

District #1 — Includes the entire area east of Ellicott Creek, south of Main Street.

District #2 — Includes the entire area west of Ellicott Creek, both sides of Main Street.

District #3 — Includes the entire area east of Ellicott Creek, north of Main Street.

Unanimously carried.

ON MOTION by Mayor Brenton, seconded by Trustee Bindert, the following resolution was adopted:

RESOLVED that regarding the Preliminary Plat for Centerpointe Subdivision, which will be considered by the Town of Amherst Planning Board on November 17, 1988, the Board of Trustees of the Village of Williamsville hereby expresses its opposition to the preliminary plat submission to the extent that it proposes entry onto a Village street.

For the reasons discussed in earlier communications to the Town of Amherst, the Village Board remains adamant in its opposition to any Centerpointe development which would include ingress and/or egress onto Evans, Academy or Rinewalt Streets.

The inadequacy of these streets to carry any

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additional volume of traffic would require the traffic overflow to seek alternate Village routes, which would result in detrimental consequences to Village residents.

Unanimously carried.

Trustee Schlifke had no report and no resolutions.

Trustee Sweeney reported the Environmental Committee meeting will be changed to December 8th at 7:30 P.M.

Trustee Bindert reported that the Village Youth and Recreation Board held their annual Halloween Party the Saturday before Halloween. They anticipated 200-250 people and had in excess of 650 children and adults. The party was a big success. They had a story teller, a magician-clown, a folk singer, pumpkin decoration and cider and donutholes. He commended the Youth and Recreation Board for their hard work.

ON MOTION by Trustee Bindert, seconded by Trustee Kibby, the following resolution was adopted:

RESOLVED that the Village Clerk publish notice of public hearing to be held by the Board of Trustees of the Village of Williamsville on November 28, 1988 at 7:30 P.M. in the Village Hall, 5565 Main Street, Williamsville, New York for the purpose of hearing all persons interested in a proposed local law which would add Section 60.32(11) to the Traffic Code and eliminate parking on the south side of Garden Parkway between the intersection of South Long Street and the Village line.

Unanimously carried.

ON MOTION by Trustee Bindert, seconded by Trustee Schlifke, the following resolution was adopted:

RESOLVED that the Village Clerk publish notice of public hearing to be held by the Board of Trustees of the Village of Williamsville on November 28, 1988 at 7:35 P.M. in the Village Hall, 5565 Main Street, Williamsville, New York for the purpose of hearing all persons interested in a proposed local law which would add Section 60.32(1B) to the Traffic Code and would eliminate parking on the north and south side of the alley which is located north of Eagle Street and runs from North Ellicott to Orchard Place.

Unanimously carried.

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ON MOTION by Trustee Bindert, seconded by Trustee Sweeney, the following resolution was adopted:

RESOLVED that the Village Clerk publish notice of public hearing to be held by the Board of Trustees of the Village of Williamsville on November 28, 1988 at 7:40 P.M. in the Village Hall, 5565 Main Street, Williamsville, New York for the purpose of hearing all persons interested in a proposed local law which would add Section 60.32(26B) to the Traffic Code and would eliminate parking on the north side of Park Drive between South Ellicott Street and Garrison Road.

Unanimously carried.

Trustee Kibby had no report and no resolutions.

Superintendent of Public Works Laubisch had no report.

ON MOTION by Mayor Brenton, seconded by Trustee Kibby, it was moved to suspend rules for public participation.

Unanimously carried.

Basil Sywenkys, 44 School Street, appealed to the Village Board to use all their power to stop the connection of Rinewalt and Academy Streets to the Centerpointe project for the following reasons.

(1) There will be no profit for the Village but only a burden on the residents of the streets.

(2) There will be more problem with crime. Presently the streets are closed and the neighbors know each other.

(3) A through street will be a big burden on the children who attend the Academy Street School. Many times it is hard to go thru Academy and Rinewalt Streets now when there are activities at the school and cars are parked on both sides of the street.

(4) Since this is a Town project, let the Amherst Board take the burden on their shoulders.

He asked if in the future the Town of Amherst or County of Erie could force the Village to allow connection of these two streets. Mayor Brenton stated the Village has a local law which requires the developer to come to the Village for permission. If the developer wishes to pursue the matter, the outcome will probably be decided by the courts because the Village Board is adamantly opposed to the connection of these streets to the development.

Mary Anne Avery, 64 Garrison Road, asked about the performance bond posted by the Town. How does that work? Mayor Brenton stated he can't answer that question. The construction will be within the Town of Amherst so their laws will govern the procedures.

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Harmon Whipple, 51 Garden Parkway, stated that at the last meeting it was agreed that Conrail will be blocked off and this has not been done. Mayor Brenton said this was a statement he did make and the Superintendent of Public Works has been working on barricades and these will be erected after leaves are picked up.

Fred Avery, 64 Garrison Road, is concerned not only about the Centerpointe traffic, but also about the traffic which comes down Garrison Road before it reaches Evans Street. The traffic, including heavy trucks, has been doubling. The shoulders of the road are breaking up. He is concerned about the storm sewer in front of his house at 64 Garrison. It is getting muck and rock from up and down Garrison Road. He asked for help in bolstering up that storm sewer. He asked for blacktopping to level off the area so the water does not accumulate there. Mayor Brenton stated that Garrison Road is a five ton street and he asked the Superintendent of Public Works to assure that the signs are correct and Trustee Bindert to ask the Amherst Police to enforce the weight limit.

Yvonne Kaye, 72 Rinewalt Street, thanked Mayor Brenton for his opposition to the Centerpointe curb cuts at the Erie County meeting today. She also thanked the Board for the resolution just adopted in opposition to the preliminary plat. It is consistent with the Homeowners' and the Village Board's opposition to this connection into the Centerpointe development.

Lewis Steele, attorney for the Homeowners group, provided the Board with a copy of a statement delivered at the Erie County hearing this afternoon. He expressed his appreciation and gratitude for the Board's very strong and very positive action against the preliminary plat application. He stated there will be some limited construction activity in the Centerpointe area but it will not have anything to do with the subdivision and doesn't have anything to do with the entrance of Essjay into the Village.

Dan Chase, 157 Highland, stated he feels there is a danger which exists at the corner of Main and Cayuga in the right turn lane going north on Cayuga toward Main Street because drivers do not see the "No Right Turn" sign. It is blocked by trees. Perhaps it should be moved next to the light. Trustee Bindert stated he has written to New York State Department of Transportation asking that the sign be put overhead so it would be more visible to on going traffic. They responded they would look into the matter but to date we have received no further correspondence on it. They did put a "no parking" sign on top of the "no turn on red" sign so with the removal of the Village "no parking" sign which was also blocking the view, the "no turn on red" sign is now more visible.

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ON MOTION By Mayor Brenton, seconded by Trustee Kibby, it was moved to return to the regular agenda.

Unanimously carried.

ON MOTION by Mayor Brenton, seconded by Trustee Kibby, it was moved to adjourn the meeting at 8:20 P.M.

Unanimously carried.






