Deputy Mayor Carolyn Schlifke called the meeting to order with the Pledge of Allegiance at 7:35 P.M.

ON MOTION by Deputy Mayor Schlifke, seconded by Trustee Bindert, the minutes of the regular meeting held November 28, 1988 were approved.

ON MOTION by Deputy Mayor Schlifke, seconded by Trustee Bindert, the minutes of the public hearing held on a proposed Local Law to add Section 60.32(11) to the Traffic Code which would eliminate parking on the south side of Garden Parkway between South Long Street and Village line held November 28, 1988 were approved.

Unanimously carried.

ON MOTION by Deputy Mayor Schlifke, seconded by Trustee Bindert, the minutes of the public hearing held on a proposed Local Law to add Section 60.32(1B) to the Traffic Code which would eliminate parking on the alley located north of Eagle Street held November 28, 1988 were approved.

ON MOTION by Deputy Mayor Schlifke, seconded by Trustee Bindert, the minutes of the public hearing held on a proposed Local Law to add Section 60.32(26B) to the Traffic Code which would eliminate parking on the north side of Park Drive between South Ellicott Street and Garrison Road held November 28, 1988 were approved.

ON MOTION by Trustee Bindert, seconded by Trustee Sweeney, the following resolution was adopted:

RESOLVED THAT Local Law #14-1988, which will add Section 60.32(1B) to the Traffic Code and will eliminate parking on the north and south side of the alley to the north of Eagle Street, and was the subject of a public hearing on November 28, 1988, is hereby adopted

Unanimously carried.

Trustee Kibby had no report and no resolutions.

Trustee Schlifke commended the Williamsville Business Association for the work they have done on the decorating of Main Street. They have done a wonderful job in bringing attention to the Village of Williamsville. This year they have extended their efforts into the residential area. They are offering prizes which have been donated by the Williamsville businesses. There will be a judging during the next week and the Village is looking very festive.

Trustee Sweeney reminded the Senior Citizens of their annual obligation for filing their tax exemption applications to be

eligible for a partial tax exemption. This is an exemption of Village real property tax for residents for homeowners over 65. Those who have participated in this program in the past have been sent a reminder. Anyone else who believes they qualify should contact the Village office prior to the end of the year. Trustee Sweeney also reported that the fall tree planting program has been completed under the auspices of the Beautification Committee. Sixteen trees have been planted this year. He noted that the nursery who planted the trees stated one of the main reasons for trees dying is the application of salt during the winter so he will be writing to the Williamsville Businessmen's Association to notify their members to exercise some caution in the use of salt on their walks.

Superintendent of Public Works Laubisch reminded Village residents that there is a parking ban in effect from November until the end of March from 12 midnight to 6:00 A.M. If a car is parked on the street during these hours, it will be ticketed because it is a major inconvenience to snow plows.

ON MOTION by Deputy Mayor Schlifke, seconded by Trustee Bindert, it was moved to suspend rules for public participation.

Unanimously carried.

Rita Andrews, 128 South Union Road, stated that the Williamsville Caroling will be held on Sunday at the Williamsville Water Mills. She also mentioned the barricades on the Conrail property are always being moved against the fence and wondered if the fence could be reinforced. Superintendent Laubisch stated the logs weigh 350-400 pounds each and he would look into heavier logs.

Cliff Horey, 106 Highland, asked why the other two local laws restricting parking were not adopted. Trustee Bindert stated those proposals were due for additional discussion.

Maryanne Avery, 64 Garrison Road, stated someone has spray painted the new drinking fountain in Garrison Park. She, also, requested additional trees be planted in Garrison Park to absorb the noise. Trustee Schlifke stated that trees have not been planted in the parks for a long time with the exception of the one planted in memory of Mrs. Brenton, who passed away this year and who was active in park activities. Perhaps next year we can replace some others that have been lost.

ON MOTION by Trustee Schlifke, seconded by Trustee Bindert it was moved to return to the regular agenda.

Unanimously carried.
